

Intercultural Education resources for Erasmus Students and their Teachers

The IEREST Project aims at developing, testing and disseminating an *Intercultural Path* (namely, a set of teaching modules) to be provided to Erasmus students before, during, and after their experience abroad, in order to encourage learning mobility and to support students in benefiting as much as possible from their international experiences in terms of personal growth and intercultural competencies.
